MISSION STATEMENT**

The Faith Formation Office serves to minister to people of all ages and abilities by providing sound catechesis, spiritual support, direction, and the resources to help put people not only in touch with, but also in communion and intimacy with, Jesus Christ. The office will strive to stay true to Christ’s mission to spread the Gospel.

## PART I: CURRICULUM

The goal of the St. Louis Catholic Community is to provide ongoing faith formation opportunities that lead to the living out of our faith on a daily basis. We realize that the knowledge and understanding of all that is Catholic cannot be conveyed in any single program. With this in mind, our parish formation program provides learning opportunities which address the teachings, prayers and traditions of the Church as well as scripture, service and spirituality.

This year, Levels 1 through 5 are using the Sadlier Series, We Believe Project Disciple. This series integrates worship, mission, and vocation with home resources that bring the entire parish together with the children on their faith journey. Each week the children receive a home and family activity which includes family projects and activities to complete together. The young people in our junior high enter into a three (3) year program of study and service focusing on recognizing the work of the Holy Spirit and identifying the gifts they have to offer in service of the parish and wider local community.

### WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Persons of all ages are invited to participate in "theme based" catechesis throughout the year. Watch the parish bulletin for a schedule of opportunities.


### CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

This opportunity is provided for students ages 4-9 at the 10:30am liturgy. Children are invited to their own experience of the Liturgy of the Word geared toward their levels of understanding and then rejoin their families and the rest of the community gathered for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

### PRAYERS

Our Church is modeled on Jesus' invitation to "do this in memory of me." With this in mind, we invite the young people in our program to learn traditional prayers of the Church as well as the ability to formulate their own prayers expressive of their personal relationship with God.

## PART II: STUDENT PROGRAMS

### ELEMENTARY

Families have the choice of day according to availability:

Mondays 5:15 pm – 6:45 pm  
Tuesdays 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm

- Theme for Level 2: The Eucharist/Jesus
- Theme for Level 3: The Church
- Theme for Level 4: The Commandments
- Theme for Level 5: The Sacraments

### JUNIOR HIGH (Levels 6 - 8)

Monday evenings from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm. Because we are called to love and serve, students spend part of their Junior High years in our service program in the community.

## HOME STUDY

The option of a parent teaching their child at home may be available. Please contact the Director of Faith Formation for information about this program.

## OUT OF SEQUENCE STUDENTS

If a first time student has not had previous formation or has missed a year, arrangements are made with the Director of Faith Formation.

# **PART III: SACRAMENTS**

## INFANT BAPTISM

In the Sacrament of Baptism, Christians begin their life in Christ as members of the Church. As with all sacraments, the intention and faith of those celebrating it is a key element. The St. Louis Catholic Community celebrates infant baptism throughout the year. Preparation for infant baptism includes formation sessions for the parents prior to the celebration of the sacrament. Parents are strongly encouraged to attend the sessions before their child is born. The role of the godparent is to help their godchild lead a Catholic Christian life. Godparents are welcome and encouraged to attend the baptismal sessions with the parents prior to the celebration of the sacrament.

Qualifications of a godparent are:

1. Must be at least 16 years old
2. Must be a member in good standing with the Catholic Church
3. Have received all three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist
4. Is leading a life in harmony with the faith and the role to be undertaken
5. Cannot be the child's parent.

Please contact the Parish Office with any questions regarding baptism preparation.

## FIRST RECONCILIATION



Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important part of a child's growth in the Catholic faith. A child must be baptized and in Level 2 of the program or older. Preparation begins in the Fall and includes a Parent/Guardian Session.



## FIRST EUCHARIST

First Eucharist, a Sacrament of Initiation, is another important step in the faith journey of young Catholic Christians. The preparation for the reception of First Eucharist begins in January.

Young people preparing for the sacrament must be baptized and be in Level 2 of the program or older. Our family-centered catechesis on First Eucharist also involves a Parent/Guardian Session, presentation of study books, a Family Retreat Day and the celebration of First Eucharist at a weekend liturgy.

## CONFIRMATION



Confirmation is typically celebrated in the Fall following completion of Level 8 and the Confirmation Prep Program. The preparation for this sacrament occurs outside of a normal class context and is geared toward providing the knowledge, understanding and tools necessary for each person to discern their readiness for this commitment.

To fulfill the role of sponsor for someone celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation, the following must hold true:

- Is an active member in good standing with the Catholic Church
- Have received all three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist
- Is leading a life in harmony with the faith and the role to be undertaken

## RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS – RCIA

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is a parish supported process that welcomes older youth and adults who have not been baptized (catechumens), who have been baptized in another Christian tradition (candidates), or who were baptized Catholic but have not yet celebrated First Eucharist and/or Confirmation. RCIA sessions begin in October and continue through Pentecost. The youth and adults participating in RCIA are welcomed into the Church at the Easter Vigil liturgy.

## **PART IV: POLICIES**

### **ATTENDANCE**

To assure continued quality formation for your child and the other children in faith formation, please be punctual and encourage full and active participation in all sessions and activities.

If your child will be absent from classes, please notify the Faith Formation Office at (586) 468-8734 ext. 104, before class begins. If the office does not receive a parent/guardian phone call, a volunteer will be calling the family to inquire about the absence. Note that in the case of excessive absences, a special plan will need to be developed to be sure that all work is completed. If there are extenuating family circumstances which prevent a child from attending regularly, please make an appointment with Sr. Kathy so that a viable plan can be arranged.

### **BACKGROUND CHECKS**

Effective September 2003, the Archbishop of Detroit mandated that a criminal history background check be conducted for all church personnel, as well as volunteers, working in any parish who have unsupervised contact with a child, the elderly or persons with disabilities. All those serving in our Formation Program are in compliance with this directive and have attended a seminar on identifying potential abuse.

### **BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS**

Mutual respect for others, the property of others and the environment are values rooted in the Gospels. If there are behavioral issues, which are disrespectful or disruptive, parents/guardians will be notified to discuss possible solutions.

### **CANCELLATIONS AND WEATHER EMERGENCIES**

As a general rule, if area schools cancel class or dismiss early because of inclement weather, the Faith Formation classes for that day will be cancelled as well. Faith Formation class cancellations are broadcast as part of the School Closings List on channels 2, 4, and 7, as well as on WWJ and WJR AM radio stations. Information about cancellations and early closures will also be made available at the Faith Formation Office or may be on our answering machine at (586) 468-8734 ext. 104.

## COMMUNICATION

1. Your feedback about what is most helpful or about an area of improvement is most welcome. Any correspondences to this effect can be sent to Sr. Kathy in the Faith Formation office.
2. For updates and current offerings for persons of all ages, please refer to the church bulletin.

## DISCIPLINE

The emphasis on discipline should always be placed on the development of individual responsibility. If a student is causing a serious problem that is preventing a learning situation for both the individual and/or the class, the catechist is to have a discussion with the student. After unsuccessful discussions with the student, and if the situation does not then improve, the catechist is to bring the matter to the attention of the appropriate Coordinator. If a resolution to continual disruption cannot be found, the family will be offered the alternative of Home Study for the student.

## DISMISSAL

Crossing guards are present for the safety of the children as they cross Ormsby. Because of the flow of traffic and students, we ask that you park in the lot for dismissal and not on Ormsby. We also ask you to review with your child the general safety procedures for parking lots.

## EARLY DISMISSALS

If for some reason you need to pick your child up early, please notify the Faith Formation Office before class begins. At the arranged time, your child(ren) will be waiting for you to sign them out in the office.

In the event of an early dismissal, each household will be contacted with information pertinent to the situation. Children will stay in the building, in the designated "safe" place until a parent/guardian arrives. For the safety of all children, students are requested to remain inside the building until their parent/guardian, or designated ride arrives.

## FIRE SAFETY AND DISASTER PREPARATION

Safety route instructions are posted in each room of the Parish Center with directions and a visual explanation for fire or tornado emergencies. This "map" is explained to all the students and the staff conducts a safety drill each faith formation year. In addition, several areas of the parish center are designated as safety shelters. In the case of an

emergency, students will be directed to the proper shelter areas based on the specifics of the situation.

#### Building Evacuation/Bomb Threat

In the event of a bomb threat either by letter or phone, the police will be notified immediately and their instructions will be followed. If the school building is evacuated, the children will be moved to the shelter of the church.

#### FOOD AND SNACKS

If your child is in need of a snack, please be sure that is taken care of before they enter the building. Class snacks may be distributed to celebrate a special occasion. Catechists have an approved list of options for snacks based on the information we have on students with food allergies or diabetes. ***If your child has a medical condition that restricts snack options in any way, please be sure to notify us so that all children can celebrate safely.***

#### GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS

1. Treat others with respect at all times.
2. Vulgarity in any form is not acceptable and may lead to being sent home.
3. Dress neat and respectably. Inappropriate tee shirts with messages/graphics not consistent with a faith-filled value system are not appropriate and shoes with wheels are not permitted.
4. Be on-time for sessions.
5. Toys, music players, games or anything that could be considered a weapon are to be left at home.
6. Cell phones are to be turned off. Anyone texting during a session will need to have a parent/guardian retrieve their phone in the office
7. Respect for all property is expected. Any vandalism to community property or that of another individual will be repaired or replaced at the family's expense.
7. Complete all assignments in a quality and timely fashion.
8. Refrain from all forms of physical or verbal violence or harassment of any form (sexual, ethnic, religious...).

## MEDICATIONS

It is the policy of the Faith Formation Office not to dispense routine medications. However, if a parent feels a child requires medication during formation times, they may bring in the medications and administer it themselves. If a child carries emergency medication like a rescue inhaler or Epi pen, please be sure to indicate this on the medical release form in order for a procedure to be in place to safeguard students during class times.

## MEDICAL TREATMENT AUTHORIZATION FORM

Each child is to have a current Medical Treatment Authorization form on file citing the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) telephone numbers (home, work, cell phone), as well as another designated adult and their emergency contact information. This emergency form also has the family's medical doctor, hospital, insurance carrier information, as well as any of the individual children's medical conditions/medicines of which we need to be aware. If a child is diagnosed with a medical condition after registration, please inform Barbara Cilli so the emergency form can be updated.

## OFF-CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

Throughout the year, our youth will be invited to participate in service opportunities as part of their formation. For all off-campus activities special forms must be completed for students and parent drivers.

According to the Archdiocese of Detroit Policies and Procedures Manual, and concerning all off-campus activities:

### All Drivers:

- Must be at least twenty-one (21) years of age or older, and have a current, valid, and non-probationary license, and have available to show the designated administrator.
- Must submit to the designated administrator, a completed and signed Volunteer Driver Information form for each vehicle used.
- Will receive a copy of approved itinerary including routes to be followed and summary of responsibilities.

### All vehicles:

- Must be validly registered (with proof in writing) and have seatbelts/restraints for each passenger.

- Must be insured for minimum limits of \$250,000.00 per person and \$500,000.00 per occurrence (with proof in writing).

All Students attending Off-Campus Activities:

- Must produce a completed and signed Parent Permission Form for Field Trip by the date indicated on that form and before the day of the planned activity.
- No student will be allowed to take part in off-campus activities without submitting the completed, signed Parent Permission Form for Field Trip.
- Under no circumstances may students bring along non-enrolled "friends" to any off-campus activity or field trip.
- The contact person for each event or activity will be identified on the Parent Permission Form for Field Trip.

Registration of sign-up procedure for off-campus activities or field trips will go as follows:

- Pertinent forms (as named above) will be handed out or sent home to all participants.
- Description of the activity, times, contact people, deadlines, directions, and fees will be stated and explained on the Parent Permission Form for Field Trip. As stated above, forms must be completed and signed in order for the student to participate or for the adult to drive.
- All information/ forms/permission slips will be retained for seven years by the Faith Formation Office.

## REGISTRATION

St. Louis Faith Formation is open to all children in levels 1 through 9.

Parish discounted tuition applies to families who are actively participating in the life of the parish by sharing their time, talent and treasure and have completed a parish census form.

Non-discounted tuition applies to families of other parishes in the surrounding area and it is expected that they are involved in the worship and activities at their home parish.

## SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY

It is the policy of the Archdiocese of Detroit to make every effort to provide an educational and work environment free from all forms of harassment. This policy applies to the actions of all staff, volunteers and students.

Respect for the dignity and worth of each individual is a basic tenet of the Gospels and the St. Louis Catholic Community. Everyone is entitled to an environment free from discriminatory practices, including sexual and other forms of illegal harassment. Any registered complaint will be handled confidentially by the Director of Faith Formation and valid complaints will result in disciplinary action.

Students are expected to treat all persons, including each other, with respect and dignity. Accordingly, inappropriate behavior directed at faculty, staff or other students will not be tolerated. Such behavior will result in disciplinary action, up to and including exclusion from the program.

Examples of Sexual Harassment: sexual innuendoes; jokes of a sexual nature; sexual propositions; sexually suggestive pictures or cartoons; foul and obscene language, jokes, or gestures; unwanted and unnecessary physical contact and/or unwelcome comments about appearance

### **STEWARDSHIP**

God asks each of us to care for, use, and share the gifts that have been given us. For this reason we present the concept of *Stewardship* to the students as part of their learning process. Envelopes for use at weekend Liturgy are available on the entrance tables in church or through the Faith Formation Office.

### **TUITION AND FEES**

The St. Louis Catholic Community tuition for registered families with children in Levels 1 through Confirmation is \$75.00 per one child, \$100 per two children, or \$125.00 per family. For unregistered families with children in levels 1 through Confirmation, tuition is \$150 per one child, \$200 per two children, or \$250 per family.

In addition to the above tuition, there is a sacramental book fee for those students enrolled in each of the First Eucharist and Reconciliation Sacrament Programs.

For volunteers other than catechists, a \$2.00 tuition credit is awarded every time a volunteer service is performed. Additional credits are available for drivers in the Junior High Service Program. Scholarships and special payment arrangements can be made through the Director of Faith Formation or the Pastor.

## **PART V: LIVING THE MISSION AND MINISTRY OF JESUS**

As part of our responsibility to provide the young members of our parish with opportunities for full, conscious, active participation in the church, our faith community offers the following for our young people to become more involved in the mission and ministry of the Church.

### **ALTAR SERVER**

This ministry is open to all young members of our parish age 9 and up. Under the direction of the Worship Coordinator, altar servers are trained to assist the celebrant at weekend liturgies. It is asked that altar servers commit for at least one year, but it is hoped that they will return year after year.

### **MUSIC MINISTRY**

All young members of our community, between the ages of 5 and 17, are invited to participate in our music ministry program, under the leadership of the Director of Music. Groups begin each October and practice through Pentecost. If you are interested in joining the Junior Handbell Choir, Junior Handchime Choir, God's Angels Choir (2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup>) or the Youth Praise Band and Choir (7<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>) please contact Ms. Linda Knopp 468-8734 Ext. 109. Groups perform once or twice a month at various liturgies and at special family liturgies.

## **PART VI: FAMILY INVOLVEMENT**

Parents are the primary teachers of their children. Your children learn what is important by observing your action and attitudes. For this reason, we incorporate into our programming opportunities for parents to become involved and celebrate with their children. We expect each family to be in attendance at family events and to volunteer their time according to the gifts God has bestowed on them.

## FAMILY LIFE EVENTS

Family Life events are open to all parish families. These opportunities have either a social, educational, or spiritual component for the whole family. Watch the Church bulletin for upcoming events.

## LITURGIES

There are special Liturgies for children that are offered each year geared toward a whole family experience. When these Liturgies are scheduled on a day of the week that your child does not regularly attend, their attendance at liturgy is considered their Faith Formation Session for that week.

It is expected that each family involved in the formation program is attending weekend liturgies on a regular basis here or at their home parish.
